#### Stage 1: Desired Results

#### Course Description and Purpose:

The Literature and Communications program for grade 8 is balanced and comprehensive. The language arts processes of reading, writing, listening, and speaking are taught in an integrated and interrelated manner. Course components include the study of rich and varied literature; writing in the genres of comparison of various media, persuasive, expository, and response to literature. Direct instruction within this course includes language arts skills and strategies, including close reading, analysis, vocabulary development, and grammar; and a balance of oral and written and language activities. Students will be given the opportunity to practice the following communications strategies: Outlining, multimedia presentation, on-demand responses (both oral and written), applying advanced grammar to their own writing, debate and the synthesis of several sources in proving a well-defined claim. They will also continue to refine their ability to communicate effectively through writing, reading, speaking, and listening.
