It is a sincere privilege to write to you as the Superintendent of our outstanding school district! On the pages that follow, it is clear the students in our classrooms continue to perform at the highest levels, not only in the Lake Country area but, across the great State of Wisconsin. You can be proud of these accomplishments which are a direct result of the support and commitment to excellence the entire community provides our district. As a staff, we take our role in educating students seriously and remain committed to doing all that is within our abilities to fulfill our mission to ensure that every child achieves maximum potential for future success as a self-directed, problem-solving, responsible, life-long learner in the 21st century.

Throughout the 2014-15 school year there was significant district level work geared towards meeting the outcomes delineated in our Action Plan for Excellence in Personalized Learning and our Vision for Excellence in Character and Community. Our *staff* continues to learn and grow to meet this challenge while also learning about the new state accountability and assessment systems. We will be conducting *Curricular and Programmatic Reviews* of our Social Studies, PE/Health, and Special Education programs and make changes as necessary to ensure these programs prepare our students for their futures in an ever-changing world. 





DEFINITION OF TERMS – SCHOOL FUNDS AND DEFINITIONS

Funds

- **Fund 10 General Fund:** Used to account for all financial transactions relating to the district's current operations except for those required to be accounted for in other funds.
- **Fund 21 Special Revenue Trust Fund:** Used to account for trust funds that can be used for district operations. The source of such funds is gifts and donations from private parties.
- **Fund 27 Special Education Fund:** Used to account for special education and related services funded wholly or in part with state or federal special education aid.
- **Fund 39 Referendum Approved Debt Service Fund:** Used for recording transactions related to repayment debt issues. Debt tax levies must be recorded in these funds.
- **Fund 41 Capital Expansion Fund:** Used for projects financed with the tax levy. State statute restricts the use of this fund for buildings and sites. These expenditures are for acquiring and remodeling buildings and sites and maintenance or repairs that extend or enhance the service life of buildings and building components, sites and site components.
- Fund 50 Food Service Fund: Used to record all revenues and expenditures related to pupil food service activities.

School Building Administration: Principal, student services, secretaries

Business Administration: business officials, supplies and services, transportation, operational staff salaries, equipment, heat, electricity, cleaning services, systems maintenance, site improvement and repair

Central Services: postage, printing, telephone, technology, copiers, business machines, purchased services, supplies **Insurance**: liability, property, unemployment, workers' compensation

Other Support Services: early retirement benefits

Inter-Fund Operating Transfer: transfer for special education







CALL TO ORDER

After a review of the district expenditures during the 2013-2014 school year, and the proposed 2014-2015 school budget, Ms. Trimble, School Board President, who served as the temporary chairperson during the election of the permanent chairperson, called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Mr. Rosch seconded and the motion was carried by a unanimous voice vote.
