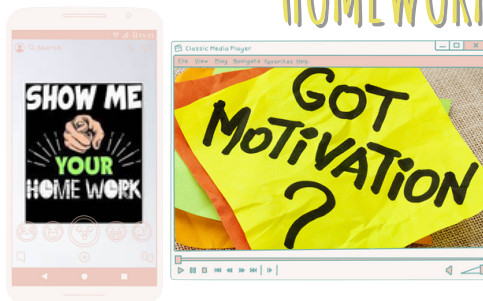
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Two truths and a lie....have you ever played this game? If not, it is a game where participants try to trick the other player or players into believing which of their three statements is a lie.

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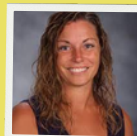
